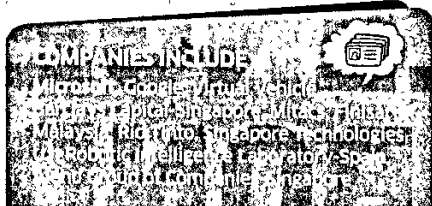

Even those from the best colleges are looking for that extra edge on their resumes in uncertain times. This June, IIT-Bombay student Vivek S applied for an international internship to add the 'global exposure' to his profile that will keep him ahead of his peers in a bad market. The material science student was accepted by nuclear and renewable energy maker Areva and posted for two months in UGINE, France. He received €1,200 each month, was given the freedom to work in labs like any other employee and will be named a co-author in a journal on nuclear energy.

Although Vivek still has a year to go before his placements, this international internship will lift his resume. "This will give me an upper hand during the recruitment season," said the third-year student.

In a slow market, IITians are opting for more international internships that will help them during their placements. International exposure has been sought after for the last few years but all IITs have noticed a recent spike for internships in the US, Canada, Australia, Japan, Portugal, UK, France and South-East Asia.

A conscious effort by IIT-Bombay to get more international internships has led to a two-fold increase in international internships this year over last year. "More than 100 undergraduate students have opted for internships through the official internship process from IIT-Bombay. There are many more who have bagged international internships through their own efforts," said S K Mehta assistant placement officer.

At IIT-Delhi, the number of students opting for international internships has seen about 20% increase in the last two years, said Atul Vyas, assistant registrar of the college.

Internships take place in IITs after the third year. Students are often keen to work in research labs and industries after the second year too. Though the stipend is not a compulsion, most companies, research centres and universities pay the interns. A stipend can range anywhere between ₹20,000-60,000 per month and in some cases, even more, for both

Indian and international internships. The stipend is expected to cover boarding, food and travel expenses.

For their part, companies abroad have been seeking more students from India. "Companies are anticipating that things will improve, so they are offering more internships to gauge the candidates' potential," said Sudhirkumar Barai, professor-in-charge of training and placement at IIT-Kharagpur. The oldest IIT has spotted 10% increase in international internships this year compared to 2011. Around 80% of these internships are academic while the rest are corporate.

"Although almost all students would like to take up an internship abroad, only those with good academic results end up applying," said Gautam Barua, director of IIT-Guwahati.

Around 116 students went abroad for their internships in 2012 out of a batch size of 450. Some of the institutes were University of Munich, Germany; Ecole Polytechnique, France; University of Zurich, Switzerland; and INRIA, France.

Since most of the internships abroad are academic, they also help students who want to pursue a master's degree later instead of joining a firm.

IIT-Kanpur has seen a steep rise in these internships as well and especially with departments like chemical engineering that have made it part of their third-year curriculum with course credits. More students are interested in international internships right after their second year, said Arpit Jain, internship coordinator at student placement office.

Education analysts say that the foreign exposure is more than cultural and these internships push their careers a long way. "The extent of research we do in India is minuscule compared to that in advanced economies like the US or even places like Singapore and Hong Kong. People are going abroad simply for lack of enough opportunities here," said Narayanan Ramaswamy, KPMG head for education.

TAKING IIT CUE, UGC UPLOADS NET ANSWER KEYS ONLINE

NEW DELHI: Taking a cue from the Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs), the University Grants Commission has uploaded the answer keys of the UGC-NET examination on its website, and sought feedback from the public.

Wrong questions, accounting for as many as 14 marks, were detected after the IITs uploaded answer keys of its IIT-JEE (Joint Entrance Examination) for the first time this year.

The UGC, also a central government education organisation, decided to follow suit with its National Eligibility Test — which deals with the appointment of assistant professors and awarding of junior research fellowships.

“It will bring about more transparency and accountability in the NET examination,” said UGC chairperson Ved Prakash.

After receiving feedback on the answer keys, the UGC will seek expert opinion on whether the marking scheme should be changed or not. “Sometimes, there may be some difference of opinion on what is the correct answer in the objective-type question paper,” Prakash said.

The UGC expects to declare the results of the UGC-NET examination by the middle of September, as against the usual deadline of late October — once experts submit their report.

More than 5.5 lakh students appeared for the national exam on June 24 this year.

65% jump in higher edu enrolment in 4 yrs: Sibal

New Delhi: The number of students enrolling for higher education appears to have shot up dramatically. According to a recent survey done by the HRD ministry, the gross enrolment ratio (GER) for higher education has shot up from 12.4 to 20.2, a rise of almost 65% in the past four years.

Disclosing this on Monday at a conference titled EducatioNext, organized by The Times of India, HRD minister Kapil Sibal said that the figure for India had been hovering around 12. However, according to a survey, it has surged in the last four years. The main focus of the conference, attended by academics and education experts, was "India — The Education Superpower of the Future".

"The results of the survey are tentative and not firm, but if validated, they are very encouraging. The ratio for developed countries is in the region of 35-

40. The survey results show that we are getting there. If they hold, we can expect the ratio to go up to 30-35 by 2029," he said. GER is a measure of the percentage of the relevant age group that is enrolled.

The minister said that the difference in the GER is often the difference between developed and developing countries. "The gross turnover of ideas, generated by the university system, is the real wealth of nations — often more valua-

ble than GDP," he said.

Sibal said higher enrolment in universities is throwing up its own set of challenges. "This large influx into higher education (beyond 10+2 level) would possibly require 800 more universities and 50,000 more colleges. How can the physical infrastructure be built so quickly? Yet there can't be any delay. Even a year's delay means the child is older by a year," he said.

By 2030, the number of Indian students vying for university education will touch 400 million, the size of the population of the US, human resources and development minister Kapil Sibal said on Monday.

The situation requires out-of-the-box solutions, he said. "We have come up with a five-point action plan based on the advantages of new technology. You will hear much more about this in the coming days," he added, listing out the five measures.

These measures seek to harness the

internet and cloud-computing with low cost devices like tablets, including Akash, the Rs 1,500 tablet adopted by HRD ministry for free distribution (with 50% of the cost being borne by the educational institution and the other 50% by the Centre), and mobile phones.

Sibal added that 2.5 lakh villages would be connected by fibre optics to build a powerful information highway.

"The last-mile connectivity would be wireless — accessed by tablets and mobile phones. Not just courses, video uploads can create virtual workshops and labs as well as self-assessment procedures," he said.

Wary of Oppn, Sibal amending education reforms Bills for consensus

CORNERED in the face of unrelenting opposition to his education Bills, Human Resource Development Minister Kapil Sibal is lining up Bill after Bill before the Union Cabinet to bring in amendments that will address the Opposition's concerns.

Opened for discussion last week and then withdrawn for consultation when it came under attack, the National Accreditation Regulatory Authority for Higher Educational Institutions Bill is also set to go the amend-

ment way. Following two rounds of inconclusive discussions with members of the Opposition and UPA ally Trinamool Congress on the merits of the Bill, the HRD ministry is now proposing new amendments in a last ditch attempt to build consensus.

The Bill mandates that every higher education institute and academic programmes it runs must be accredited for quality by an accreditation agency. The Bill calls for setting up a National Accreditation Regulatory Authority for Higher Education that will monitor the accreditation agencies.

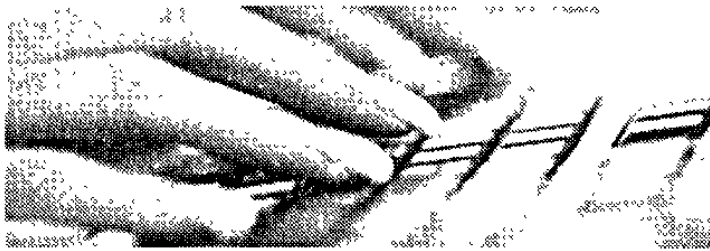
Opposition members have raised questions on this Bill alleging that it amounted to infringement of the states' autonomy to establish and run institutes. They have also questioned a particular clause in the Bill that says that the government can exempt certain in-

stitutes from undergoing accreditation. A BJP member had challenged this clause and questioned the government's motives saying that the government could misuse it to exempt foreign institutes/ institutes running in collaboration with foreign institutes. Others have demanded that the accreditation regulatory authority be made more representative and members from the OBC/ SC/ ST and minority community also be nominated to it. The amendments to the Bill will attempt to address these issues and allow states more say in the process of accreditation.

देश के प्रतिष्ठित इंजीनियरिंग, मेडिकल और लॉ कॉलेजों में प्रवेश के लिए होने वाले परीक्षा में साल दर साल गलत सवाल और पाठ्यक्रम से बाहर के प्रश्न पूछे जाने का मामला बढ़ते जा रहे हैं।

इससे प्रवेश परीक्षा में शामिल छात्रों की परेशानी के साथ अदालतों में मुकदमों का भी बोझ बढ़ रहा है। आईआईटी, एम्स व अन्य कॉलेजों के लिए आयोजित प्रवेश परीक्षा में गलत सवाल पूछे जाने की शिकायत पिछले साल भी समाने आई थी। इस साल भी अखिल भारतीय संयुक्त इंजीनियरिंग प्रवेश परीक्षा (एआईईईई), दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के लॉ कॉलेजों में

प्रवेश परीक्षा में गलत सवाल पूछे जाने को लेकर आधा दर्जन मामले हाईकोर्ट में आए हैं। याचिका दायर करने वालों का आरोप है कि गलत प्रश्नों की वजह से उनके भविष्य से खिलवाड़ हुआ है।

Technical institutes seek nod to shut ops

Despite government claims that it was trying to increase seats and enrolment in technical courses, several technical institutes have requested permission to close operations due to inadequate admissions to various courses being offered by them.

Andhra Pradesh with 56 institutes putting a request for closure leads the states in the country. It is fol-

lowed by Rajasthan (18), Uttar Pradesh (17) and Gujarat (13) in which several institutes have also put in a similar request.

The closure has also put the role of All India Council for Technical Education, the apex body to regulate and standardise technical education, under a scanner as it has been facing charges of irregularities. AICTE's chairman has been suspended on charges of irregularities while the former member secretary

is also facing a CBI case.

The request for closure

received from so many institutes has raised serious doubts over the functioning of the AICTE under former senior officials who are already under a scanner.

Government sources claimed that these private technical institutes have made the request to the AICTE. "The request for permission of closure has been made due to poor admissions in these institutions," sources said.

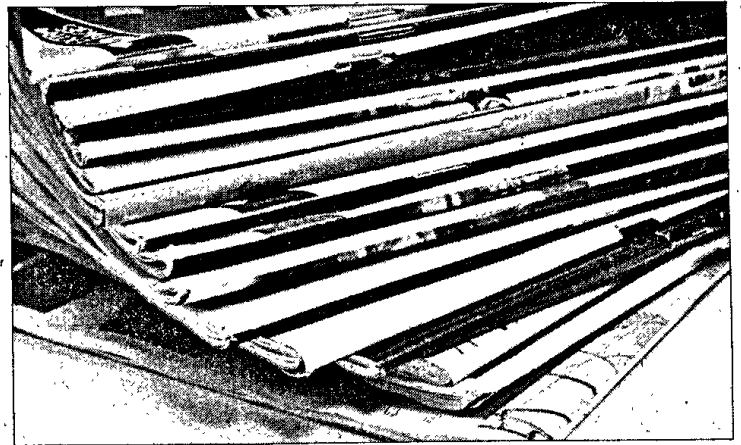
Maharashtra (7), Haryana

(6), Punjab (6), Madhya Pradesh (5), Karnataka (5) and Chhattisgarh (4) are the states in which private institutes have made a request for closure of operations for want of adequate students.

According to HRD ministry sources, more than 200 technical institutions had submitted applications for closure of courses due to poor admission. The AICTE has already stopped giving approval to any new college till 2014.

इसके लिए आपको कंप्यूटर में रिमोट एक्सेस सेट अप करना होगा। आपको अपने होम कंप्यूटर पर स्मॉल सर्वर एप्लिकेशन इंस्टॉल करने की जरूरत होगी। लॉगमीइन (www.logmein.com) से आप विंडोज और मैक ओएस एक्स के लिए सर्वर सॉफ्टवेयर डाउनलोड कर सकते हैं। सर्वर रन करने पर आपको अपने अकाउंट में किसी कंप्यूटर या फोन/टैबलेट के वेब ब्राउजर के जरिए लॉग इन करना होगा। अब आप प्रोग्राम रन कराने या फाइल भेजने या एक्सेस करने के लिए होम सिस्टम को कहीं से भी कंट्रोल कर सकते हैं। आप फाइल को रिमोटली एक्सेस करने के लिए बफैलो क्लाउडस्टेशन जैसी नेटवर्क-कनेक्टेड हार्ड ड्राइव भी खरीद सकते हैं।

फोन से एक्सेस करें डाटा

अगर आप कंटेंट वेब ब्राउजर की जगह अपने मोबाइल/टैबलेट डिवाइस पर एक्सेस करना चाहते हैं, तो स्मार्टफोन प्लेटफॉर्म के लिए कई फ्री एप्स उपलब्ध हैं। इसके लिए आपको ये एप्स अपने होम पीसी में इंस्टॉल करनी होंगी। ऐसी फ्री एप्लिकेशन- टोनीडो आईओएस, एंड्रॉयड, विंडोज फोन7 और ब्लैकबेरी पर वाई-फाई और 3जी पर काम करती हैं। www.tonido.com से आप इसे डाउनलोड कर सकते हैं। इसी तरह पोकास्ट एप्लिकेशन भी आपके कंप्यूटर को फ्री में पर्सनल क्लाउड में कन्वर्ट करती है।

पीसी से म्यूजिक स्ट्रीमिंग

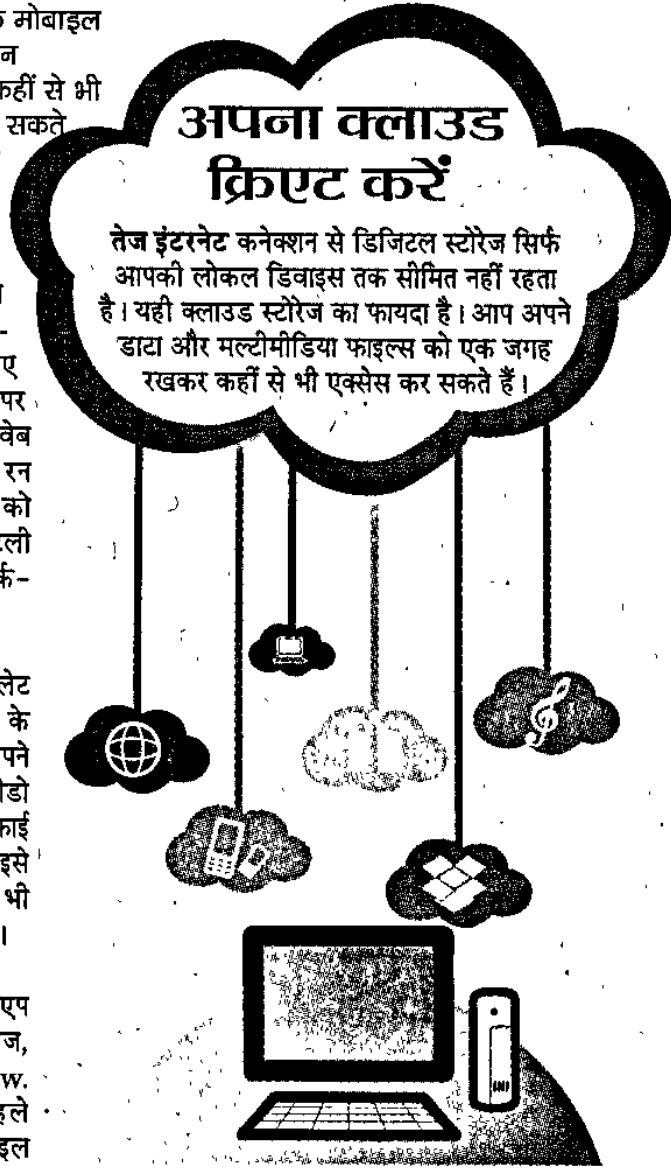

ड्रॉपबॉक्स ऑनलाइन फाइल स्टोरेज से कहीं ज्यादा काम की चीज हो सकती है। आप ड्रॉपबॉक्स को ड्रॉपट्यूंस का इस्तेमाल करके एक्सेस कर सकते हैं। www.droptun.es में विजिट करें और अपने ड्रॉपबॉक्स अकाउंट में साइन इन करें। आप अपनी फाइल को वेब ब्राउजर में एक्सेस कर सकते हैं और बिना ट्रांसफर किए

अपना क्लाउड क्रिएट करें

तेज इंटरनेट कनेक्शन से डिजिटल स्टोरेज सिर्फ आपकी लोकल डिवाइस तक सीमित नहीं रहता है। यही क्लाउड स्टोरेज का फायदा है। आप अपने डाटा और मल्टीमीडिया फाइल्स को एक जगह रखकर कहीं से भी एक्सेस कर सकते हैं।
