# Areva signs fellowship pact with IIT-Bombay

## IIT-B STUDENTS WARNED ABOUT LEOPARD ATTACKS

**MUMBAI:** Officials have asked students of the Indian Institute of Technology - Bombay (IITB) to be careful while on the campus, on account of increased leopard sightings.

Students were sent instructions, asking them to be more vigilant while moving around in the campus, through an email recently.

"It has been reported by our patrolling guards as well as our residents that leopard movements are being observed in the Hillside/Sonari Bagh/Lakeside area," said an email, sent to students from the security office, asking them to avoid using a specific road after sunset.

The IITB campus border abuts the Sanjay Gandhi National Park, and has had leopard visits on several occasions in the past.

The institute has also decided to increase lighting facilities around the campus and has added one more watch post inside the campus. Students have also been advised to move around in groups and not be out too late at night, said U Yajnik, dean of student affairs.

However, students don't seem to be too affected. "We keep getting such emails, no one is that worried. We are used to this by now," a student said.

# UGC, AICTE responsible for low quality of education: Arindam

Govt has ordered Internet service providers to block access to more than 70 Urls, critical to IIPM

NEW DELHI: The Indian government has ordered Internet service providers to block access to more than 70 Urls that seem to contain material that is critical of the Indian Institute of Planning and Management (IIPM).

The order signed by Subodh Saxena of the lepartment of telecommunications (DoT) was issued on 14 February. The URLs isted include that of the **Jniversity Grants Commis**ion (UGC), which states hat IIPM is not a univerity and 'does not have the ight of conferring or grantng degrees as specified by JGC' as well as those of ome satire-based sites. The move comes amid the overnment being criticised or recent steps that have een regarded as attempts o curb freedom of speech. JoT and UGC couldn't be mmediately reached for omment.

IIPM Head Arindam Chaudhuri said the matter

However, he said, 'Last year one of our channel partner had filed a suit against Google and submitted ISPs about certain defamatory articles about us on the internet. After hearing the suit, court had asked Google to remove those links. However, Google failed to comply the order. Subsequently, the court has asked ICERT to block the those defamatory Urls till further orders after hearing

the application filed by him and issued notice to IIPM to be as one of the respondent and we will file our reply.

Also, upon being asked that some satire pieces were also in the same list, Chaudhuri categorically commented, 'I have no objections on any satire nor would I have filed anything against them were I to do the same personally. In a democracy that is basic freedom of speech. However, I am glad that defamatory links with malicious

interests have been ordered to be removed.

On UGC links, he said, 'UGC and AICTE are organisations full of bribe-seeking corrupt people, where even at the top they have a track record of being caught red-handed and being jailed. The standard of education they have created in the nation is shameful to say the least. IIPM is proud to have no affiliation from them and proud that it imparts a quality of education that is at par with the

best globally, thanks to our independence of approach and non-caring attitude towards UGC.

'I suspect at the behest of some of our petty competitors with dirty past record, UGC had been deliberately spreading misleading information about IIPM to hurt its business interests and had gone to the extent of calling IIPM a fake university. For the same, the Delhi High Court had reprimanded it and given clear direction to remove the same allegation because IIPM, like ISB does not give any degree of its own nor has it ever claimed to do the same or has it ever called itself an university. UGC's false campaign is utterly defamatory against which IIPM has also released public notices in newspapers and the same is available on the net. So there is no doubt about the defamatory intent of the UGC/AICTE campaign and I am glad that the court has now ordered the removal of those links,' he added.

## Soon, cars that auto-drive while you nap

London: Imagine a car that drives on its own while you take a power nap? Robotic technology from Oxford University that enables a car to 'drive itself' for stretches of a route has been shown to be effective.

Scientists are calling it a milestone on the way to creating everyday vehicles that can offer 'auto drive' for some parts of a journey, taking the strain off drivers during a busy commute or school run.

The adapted electric cars have a low-cost navigation system that can clearly identify its surroundings using small cameras and lasers discreetly built into its body and linked to a computer in the boot.

The new car gives a glimpse of what the driver's experience of an auto drive-enabled car of the future might be like: the technology is controlled from an iPad on the dashboard that flashes up a prompt message, offering the driver the option of the car taking over for a portion of a familiar route — touching the screen then switches to 'auto drive' where the robotic system takes over.

At any time a tap on the brake pedal will return control to the human driver.

Paul Newman from Oxford said, "Because our cities don't change very quickly robotic vehicles will look out for familiar structures as they pass by so that they can ask a human driver 'I know this route, do you want me to drive?' and the driver can choose to let the car take over.

"We are working on a low-cost navigation system independent of GPS, done with discreet sensors that are getting cheaper all the time. It's easy to imagine that this kind of technology could be in a car you could buy."
