City gets its first solar panel-powered pumps

NEW DELHI The first Renewal Energy Assisted Pump (REAP) system was installed at All India Panchayat Parishad in Mayur Vihar phase I. Delhi chief minister Sheila Dikshit inaugurated the system at a function organised on Friday.

According to officials, REAP is an easy-to-install submersible pump connected to a water tank with an especially designed motor powered by a solar panel. The system is capable of meeting the water storage and pumping needs of users in both rural and urban areas.

"This technology has been developed by BSES Yamuna Power Ltd in collaboration with IIT Delhi. The system will go a long way in reducing global warming and other green house effects. Further, it will not only reduce dependence on fossil

fuel-generated electricity supply," said Dikshit.

Dikshit further said that REAP will reduce consumption of power during peak morning hours when most customers switch on their pumps to get water.

"The technology will also prove to be useful in agriculture, hospitals, schools, hotels, malls and especially in group housing societies," she added. REAP has a capacity to draw 30,000 litre of water per hour.

NRI SCIENTIST Charged With Fraud

WASHINGTON: An Indian-American scientist has been charged with fabricating and falsifying data with regard to his research on health benefits of red wine.

Dipak Das is a professor in the department of surgery and director of the Cardiovascular Research Center at the University of Connecticut.

As a result of the conclusion of a three-year investigation, the University has frozen all externally-funded research in the laboratory of Das.

It has also declined to accept the \$890,000 in federal grants awarded to him.

Dismissal proceedings, in accordance with the university's bylaws, are currently underway, said an official release.

The comprehensive report of the investigation, which totals approximately 60,000 pages, concludes that Das is guilty of 145 counts of fabrication and falsification of data.

Inquiries are currently underway involving former members of Das' lab. No findings have been issued to date.

The University has sent letters of notification to 11 scientific journals that had published studies conducted by a member of its faculty.

Das has been employed by the Health Center since 1984, and was awarded tenure in 1993. PTI

CBSE U-turn on assessment

Board Now Wants Only Grades, Not Specific Indicators

New Delhi: All efforts made during the past two years to assess the present batch of Class 10 students of Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) on co-scholastics areas and to identify their strengths are all set to go down the drain, as the board now wants the schools to only submit grades and not the specific indicators for which the grades were granted. In fact in the online excel sheet to be filled up by the schools this year, the descriptive indicators column is missing and the CBSE has written to the schools that the descriptive indicators will be provided by the Board.

In a letter dated January 13,2012, to all the heads of institutions affiliated to the CBSE, the Board informed that it has finalized the software for all schools to download the list of candidates alongwith roll numbers and schools can complete and upload the assessment data. Interestingly in the co-scholastic areas the board has only asked for the grades of the students and stated that "Descriptive indicators shall be provided by the Board."

Meanwhile, the letter also mentioned that in the previous exam too the descriptive indicators were provided by the Board as there were many

spelling mistakes, grammatical errors and variations in the descriptive indicators provided by the schools.

CBSE has introduced Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) and grading system at the secondary level in all schools from the academic session 2009-2010. Principal of Laxman Public School, Hauz Khas, Usha Ram, who is also one of the master trainers under the CCE scheme, said: "My understanding is that schools are supposed to give the descriptive indicators, else otherwise it will have no meaning. I am yet to see the letter so I can't comment on the issue."

But many teachers feel that the whole purpose of CCE, evaluation of co-scholastic areas and identifying individual strengths of the students will be defeated if descriptive indicators are given by a computerized system.

"Case in point: a physically challenged wheelchair-bound student good in chess and a good footballer both can be given 'A grade' or a painter and a clay artist student can also be given 'A+ grade'. Now if we don't specify as to why these students were given a certain grade and instead just give a computer-generated indicator such as 'represented a team in school', how will it justify the

students' capability?" questioned a senior teacher at a Kendriya Vidyalaya.

While despite repeated attempts, the CBSE chairman could not be contacted, a senior official in the computer department at the CBSE head-quarters, "Because of the variations in descriptive indicators the board received and the errors like spellings and grammar last year, the Board decided that a set of pre-determined descriptive indicators will be used for different grades."

"For example if a school gives an 'A grade' to a student in the category of sports and indigenous sports the pre-determined indicative description will be something like: Demonstrates an analytic aptitude required and reacts appropriately to strategic situa-**Demonstrates** tions; sportsmanship; Displays a healthy team and school spirit; Discipline for practice; Has undergone training coaching; Has represented a team in school, interschool. national, international level," explained the official.

"How can one attribute a descriptive indicator like 'displays healthy team spirit' to a chess player just because he/she has been given 'A grade'?" questioned a teacher at a public school, on condition of anonymity.
