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HRD Ministry to launch IIT prep portal

Will deepen focus on open online courses through Swayam

New Delhi May 15

Gearing up for IIT? Here's some good news. In the coming two months, the government will launch the IITPAL portal and mobile app for IIT JEE aspirants, said Human Resource Development Minister Smriti Irani.

Speaking during an EPSI conference, the Minister said students can access 50 years of IIT entrance examination papers through the portal / app.

"Some of the best academicians, IIT faculty members will give video lectures, also available as audio aids, so that students can have that additional learning through the portal and the app," said Irani.

The move was announced to curb the menace of coaching institutes, said Irani. "One of the biggest pressures on the students are the IIT entrance exams, for which many students have to learn outside the classroom; they

join various coaching institutions only to pass the JEE exam," she added.

Regional language content

The MHRD Minister also announced, in conjunction with the IIT council, that the government will ensure that the JEE question paper conforms to the 12th standard syllabus, so that degree-level questions are not asked.

To address the challenges faced by students who come from various State boards and have studied in regional languages, the translation for the complete content will be available in 13 languages.

Irani said that many international MOOC (massive open online course) platforms claim to be not-for-profit but are profiteering when they ask academicians and institutions to pay for designing and putting up a course. The MOOC platform Swayam is truly free in that sense.

"We are engaging with IITs, IIMs, and Central universities, and have appealed to them to give us one diploma and one certificate course for one semester from the degree courses," said Irani. "Give

us the professor that you deem fit for engagement for that course and we will pay for the development of the course and the audio visual component, we will also pay the professors for their time and effort."

To begin with, the content will be available in 10 languages and will be provided free to every Indian citizen. The regulator will also give credit for all these courses exclusively on the Swayam platform.

"We will also ensure that over 1,000 examination centres come up in the country where citizens can take examinations for MOOC courses and receive their certification," said Irani. "These credits will also get them physical entry into any institution across the country."

To begin with, Swayam will offer 500 courses. Considering most dropouts happen after 8th standard, Swayam will also offer certification for 9th and 11th standards, and Std 10 and 12 board examinations.

Govt to bring in IIT preparation app to check coaching menace

NEW DELHI: Aiming to put a check on the rising "menace" of coaching institutes, the HRD Ministry is coming up a mobile app and portal, which would contain free lectures from IIT faculty members on various subjects and previous years' question papers of entrance tests to these premier engineering institutions.

Human Resource Development (HRD) Minister Smriti Irani on Wednesday appealed to private educational institutions to help the government in improving access, transparency and quality of higher education in India. She said this while announcing a slew of initiatives to help students with quality academic content and other support to prepare for IITs. She added that it was also decided that the questions in the IIT-JEE entrance test would conform to Class 12 syllabus.

Speaking at the National Conference on Reforming & Rejuvenating India's Higher Education organised by the Education Promotion Society for India (EPSI) in the national Capital, Irani expressed concern over the commercialisation of education.

She urged private institutions to participate in government's Unnat Bharat programme, under which premier educational institutions such as IIMs and IITs are adopting neighboring villages and rejuvenating their educational system.

Referring to the "menace of the coaching industry", Irani said one of the biggest pressures on students preparing for IIT entrance exam is to seek outside help in preparation.

"We will launch Bharat Vani App, which will provide the students with higher education study material in 22 languages. By the next year, we will provide access to the same content in 100 non-scheduled and tribal languages for greater reach and accessibility. We are also coming up with an innovative mobile app and portal, IIT Pal, which will provide engineering aspirants with IIT question papers of the past 50 years. The portal and app will have video lectures by top faculty and audio aid in 13 languages," she said.

The minister also urged EPSI, which comprises private deemed universities, to help identify elements that are compromising with students' interest for commercial benefits, thereby, bringing disrepute to the entire sector.

"When we talk about stakeholders, it is important to see who get predominance. I believe it is the students who are the main stakeholders and every policy and reform should revolve in their interest. Currently, higher education in the country is facing ripples. However, I feel looking at an issue as a challenge brings negative connotation, but viewing at it as an opportunity will bring new perspective and inspiration. We need to leverage technology to benefit from the education sector," she said. Appealing for participation by private institutions, she talked about the expansion of MOOC (massive open online course) platform named SWAYAM that has 500 courses to begin with.

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Adding a new chapter: IITs and IIMs help launch manufacturing startups

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NEW DELHI: The word startup usually conjures up images of companies, which have something to do with softwares or online retail.

But beyond the limelight, there has been a sharp rise in manufacturing startups over the past five years, especially at the incubation centres of IIMs and IITs.

"Technology institutes can provide prototyping and testing infrastructure for these ideas, and management institutes can provide active business mentoring and operational scale-up support. Incubators associated with these academic institutes can be the channel of supporting these entrepreneurs," says Kunal Upadhyay, CEO, Centre for Innovation Incubation and Entrepreneurship at IIM Ahmedabad.

The key is to make these educational institutes engage with not only student entrepreneurs, but external entrepreneurs as well. The latter can often be a source of inspiration for students and provide them live learning opportunities, adds Upadhyay.

Anil Wali, managing director, Foundation for Innovation and Technology Transfer (FTIT) at IIT Delhi, says academic institutions can serve as sources of innovative ideas, commercialisable research

and technical manpower that can be leveraged by the startups.

Apart from the basic support such as a company secretary, legal help and office space, entrepreneurs see immense benefits of being a part of an incubator by the way mentorship and interaction with the alumni.

"When we started off in March

2015, we were overwhelmed with so many business opportunities for our idea. Our mentors guided and helped us identity the key areas to focus on, got us the right meetings through their connections," says Tanuj Jhunjhunwala of Planys Technologies, incubated at IIT Madras Incubation Centre.

However, the survival rate of

startups at the end of incubation ranges from 10% to 100%.

As Upadhyay says: "It is harder for manufacturing startups to find financial support as lots of venture capital funds don't invest in them."

Satyahari Dey, MD, Science and Technology Entrepreneurs Park IIT Kharagpur blames the missing "drive in the country" for the low survival rates. Increased focus of the government, though, will work in favour of these startups in the coming years, he says.

Dey says the government should create world-class incubation campuses at all these institutions with no bar on funding, to make India the number one innovation-translation destination as well.

Tamaswati Ghosh, CEO, IIT Madras Incubation Cell says: "The government should provide channels for obtaining funds for seeding and scaling-up startups, and also help us get necessary funding clearances."

However, startups in the manufacturing space are set to grow.

"Make in India initiative is giving entrepreneurs a platform to create hype about the sector and it is the right time to launch startups. With an innovative idea in mind your chances of survival will be high," says Poyni Bhatt, COO, Society for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, IIT Bombay.

Suicides in Kota are wake-up call

HE spate of sui-cides being cides reported from the coaching capital of India, Kota, should shock all of us. Young chil-dren are killing themselves not because they are not able to get admission into any Indian Institution of Technology (IIT), but because of sheer pressure of coaching and obsession of parents with IITs. The most poignant is the case of a girl who killed herself despite 'cracking' the joint entrance examination for IIT with a good rank. She took the extreme step of ending her young life because she did not want to become an engineer but a scientist. This is indeed a sad commentary on everyone - education system, parents, media, governments and politicians.

Kota suicides represent collective failure of the society. Over the years, we have created an atmosphere in which IITs have been placed on a pedestal — an ultimate goal for young children. Any inability to reach there is considered end of career dreams for more. For middle days and considered end of career dreams for many. For middle-class and poor parents, an admission into IIT appears to be the best career option, a passport to megabuck jobs and good life. The biggest beneficiaries of this craze are coaching centres in Kota, Guntur, Hyderabad, Faridabad, Patna and elsewhere.

The frenzy begins with IITs

The frenzy begins with IITs, which themselves are under wrong impression that they are among the best engineering schools in the world. They always pride themselves by the always pride themselves by the number of students competing for each seat, hiding real aca-demic indicators such as innova-tion, research output and teacher-student ratio. Forget any comparison with MIT and Harvard, the combined research output of IITs is far below that output of IITs is far below that of just two technology universities in Singapore — National University of Singapore and Nanyang Technological University. The faculty shortage in IITs is pathetic, as pointed out by the parliamentary committee on

These kids are being deprived of basic schooling and robbed of their childhood. Their growing years are spent in 10-12 hours of rote learning and solving multiyears are spent in 10-12 nours of multi-ple choice questions, blunting their mental growth and capac-ity to think and ask questions. It is time we wake up to end this menace. We will have to work at different levels. IIT's will have to be deglamourised. Par-

have to be deglamourised. Parents need counselling and the government needs to act tough with coaching industry.

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IISc. leads country in research output

The Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bangalore, has proved that it was not adjudged the top university in the country by the Centre for nothing.

With 22,056 publications between 2002 and 2014, it was ahead of 29 top academic institutions — government and private — based on the volume of publications, according to a study commissioned by the Department of Science and Technology. This is the most number of publications from a single academic institute in India. The 2016 study, 'International Comparative Performance of India's Research Base — A Bibliometric Analysis', looked at the number of publications research institutions had in the 12-year period. Though the IITs did not make it to the top slot, seven of them made it to the top 30 with five in the top 10. It also looks at the volumes for the period of 2009-13.

'Most prolific'

The study hailed IISc. as 'India's most prolific academic institution', with its output growing from 999 to 2,224 publications between 2002 and 2014. What's more, the institute was termed the most prolific in most subject areas, with the highest number of publications between 2009 and 2013 in six subjects.

However, another section of academics were of the view that these rankings should be taken with a pinch of salt for the simple reason that not all the institutions are on the same pedestal.
