Lava eyes to enter into Guinness World Records with selfies chain

NEW DELHI: Domestic device maker Lava is all set to make "longest" self-photographs relay chain at Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi annual festival, Rendezvous on October 19, 2014.

The company is aiming to click 1,000 selfies in a rally on the third day of the festival at the Lava selfie booth to claim the world record, it said in a statement.

Lava claimed that they have worked with IIT Delhi event team over the last few days to ensure to adhere to all guidelines specified by the Guinness World Records.

Selfies will be clicked by Lava Iris X5, a smartphone recently launched by Lava and positioned as 'made for selfies'.

40 firms take part in IISc career fair

A need to adapt to fast changing technologies and trends and encourage entrepreneurship was the essential message to students at the two-day career fair of Indian Institute of Science, Samanway, 2014 that got underway on Friday.

As many as 40 companies such as IBM, Xerox, General Electric, St Gobain, JSW, Tejas Networks are among participants. Delivering the keynote, IISc Director Anurag Kumar said academic institutions teach students how to learn.

Students should use it to make themselves relevant to the industry. He also advised students to have "right expectations" when starting their career in the industry.

Mindtree Co-Founder Krishna Kumar Rangarajan highlighted how IISc should pay more attention to tapping into entrepreneurship capabilities of its students.

Even as placement process is to begin in November, a number of participating companies expressed their intent to recruit students from the institute. An earlier edition of Samanway was held in April this year .

Permanent home for IIT-BBS from next session

BHUBANESWAR: IIT Bhubaneswar (IIT-BBS) plans to move to its permanent campus at Arugul village on the outskirts of the city from the academic session 2015-16, the institute sources said on Friday.

A press release issued by IIT-BBS a day before it celebrates its third convocation, said the shifting will happen in a phased manner. It is currently operating from eight different disjointed locations in city. The permanent campus is coming up on a 950-acre plot near Jatni.

Addressing a news conference, IIT-BBS acting director Sujit Roy said the institute would for the first time award MTech degrees to 39 graduates during the Saturday convocation. A total of nine PhD and 124 BTech degrees would also be awarded.

Avinash Chander, scientific adviser to the defence minister and director general Defence Research and Development Organization, will attend the convocation as chief guest. S K Roongta, chairman, Board of Governors, IIT-BBS, will preside over the event. The institute is running BTech in five core engineering branches, joint MTech-PhD in eight specializations, joint MSc-PhD in five subjects and PhD in sciences, engineering, humanities and social sciences. The institute has over 900 students and 93 faculty members. IIT-BBS started functioning from IIT Kharagpur on July 23, 2008, and shifted operations to Bhubaneswar on July 22, 2009.

A skilled business growth for corporate India

he British Council's international organisation for cultural relations and educational opportunities launched the India Employability Survey 2014 recently. This report probes the quality of talent pools expected by Indian industry in the next 3-5 years and in that context, assesses current employability of workforces emerging from foreign, and specifically, UK universities.

The research surveyed 200 foreign and Indian companies and captured the hiring trends, defining factors for recruitment of foreign-university graduates, preferred source countries, qualifications and disciplines of study.

Speaking on the occasion, Rob Lynes, director, British Council India, said, "As organisations strive to compete and drive business growth in an increasingly global market place, they place significant importance on international education in the talent they recruit. Hiring foreign university graduates is an integral part of the talent

Now, Govt gets serious about cleaner air

Launches a more broad-based air quality index that will cover 66 cities in 5 years

Indian cities have been receiving considerable bad press across the globe for poor air pollution standards. To combat this, the Ministry of Environment and Forests launched a new Air Pollution Index on Friday to identify the most polluted regions in the country and raise awareness about health implications. The index, which has been developed with the help of health and environmental experts from organisations such as the Centre for Science and Environment, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Maulana Azad Medical College, and IIT Kanpur, expands the bandwidth of the existing air quality standard to monitor eight particulate matters, against the three scrutinised earlier. The index, which will be based on existing National Air Quality Standards, will also include a public health component, defining the quality of air in real-time and what kind of health impact it could have.

The index will be coded into six categories – good, satisfactory, moderately polluted, poor, very poor and severe – and will be launched in cities with populations of over a million by mid-December.

While launching the index, Prakash Javadekar, Minister of State for Environment, Forests and Climate Change, said this is an extension of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan started by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "It won't be business as usual," Javadekar warned, and gave examples of action being taken on pollution levels by industries across the country, especially those situated near the Ganga.

In five years, the index will cover at least 66 cities. The next rung, cities with population of half a million, will follow after that.
