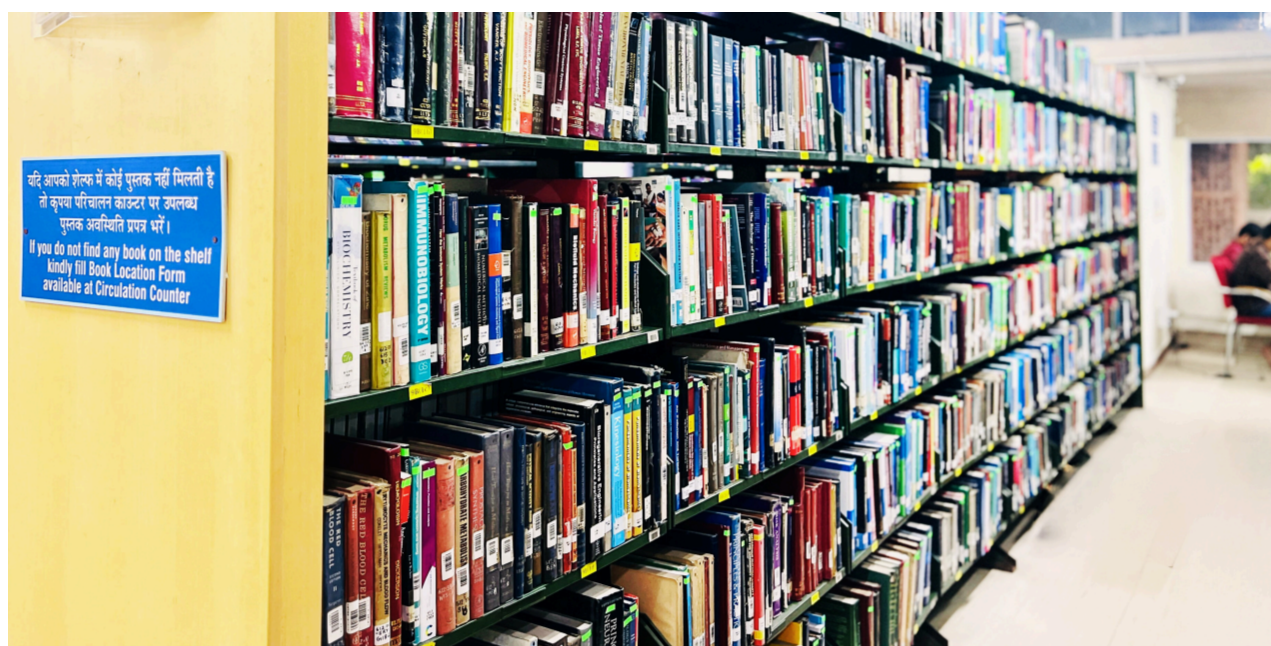
2 MISSION

4 ABOUT THE CENTRAL LIBRARY



The IIT Delhi Library System comprises a Central Library and 36 Unit Libraries of departments, centres, schools, etc., that collectively support the teaching, research, and extension programmes of the Institute. The Central Library currently has over 13000 registered users including students, faculty members, staff and alumni. The Central Library has RFID, AI, and ICT-based facilities and services. It has a state-of-the-art Computer Lab for regular library users and participants for trainings, workshops, etc. All in-house operations of the Central Library are fully computerised using Koha, an open-source library management system. The Central Library has a substantial collection of Sciences Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), biotechnology, computer science, information technology, Humanities and social sciences, management, etc.

We are the early adapter of new emerging technologies and provide state-of-the-art user support services, including Circulation of Books and Library Membership, User Assistance, Document Delivery Services, Inter-Library Loan (ILL), eNewsClipping Service, Textbooks Facility (Print and Online), Theses Consultation Facility, Institutional Repository, Discovery Service/Single Window Search, Remote Login, Research Support Services and Outreach Programs, Library App, Library Chatbot, Ask the Librarian etc. Central Library also provides a Remote Login facility to all its authorized users from anywhere in the world using a VPN and Shibboleth-based access management system. Individual Password-based access is also being provided wherever agreed by the Publishers to access the E-Resources.

The Central Library functioned as the National Resource Centre for Library and Information Sciences under the Ministry of Education, Government of India. It offered the Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT) MOOCs of 16-week duration. The Librarian and Head acted as the Coordinator/Principal Investigator from 2019 to 2021.

The Central Library also runs 12 Week NPTEL MOOCs on “Science Communication: Research Productivity and Data Analytics using Open Source Software”. This course has been quite successful, with thousands of registered learners. The Central Library in collaboration with University College London and Scientific Knowledge Services Germany offers a free online certificate course, titled “Focus on Open Science Delhi - Creating a Research Culture for the 21st Century”. The Central Library had also served as the Headquarters to the erstwhile INDEST-AICTE Consortium, one of the earliest and most successful consortia initiatives so far taken in India.

5 PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

The Central Library was set up in August 1961 in a hall in the Textile Block of the Institute. It moved to the main building of the Institute in 1968 and to its existing premises in 1988. The Central Library is spread over three floors with a total covered area of about 55,000 sq. ft. and is centrally air-conditioned. The floor-wise distribution of services and resources of the Central Library is given below:

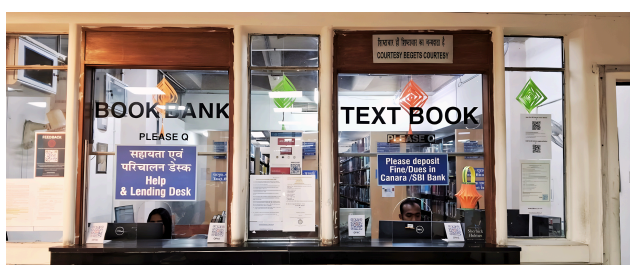

5.2. Floor Plans

Ground Floor - The ground floor houses the following important divisions/sections and facilities:

- **Collection Development Division:** The Collection Development Division (CDD) is responsible for identifying, acquisition, processing, organizing & providing access to high-quality scholarly resources that meet the education and research needs of the IIT Delhi fraternity.
- **Library Store and Purchase Section:** The Library Store and Purchase Section is responsible for important activities related to store, purchase, processing, stock management, etc. Apart from Central Library activities, the section also takes care of the Project activities. The storekeeper manages it under the supervision of an Officer Incharge.

- **Textbook & Book Bank Section:** This section consists of a room for the Incharge of the Section, with an adjoining staff area for staff in this section. The section also has a stacks area for Textbook, Book Bank, and Theses. A Separate Reading Area is available for the students inside the section for consultation purposes.
- **Computer Applications Division:** This section consists of a room for the Incharge of the Section with an adjoining computer lab and staff area of this section with servers, etc.
- **Stacks Area:** Ground Floor stacks house the social sciences, humanities, progress reports, theses, textbooks, book bank books, etc.
- **Computer Laboratory:** The lab houses 30 networked computers for providing access to different e-resources for Library users.



- **Library Reading Area:** The Reading areas are available for readers on this floor, which accommodates 162 users.



First Floor - The first floor houses the following important sections and facilities:

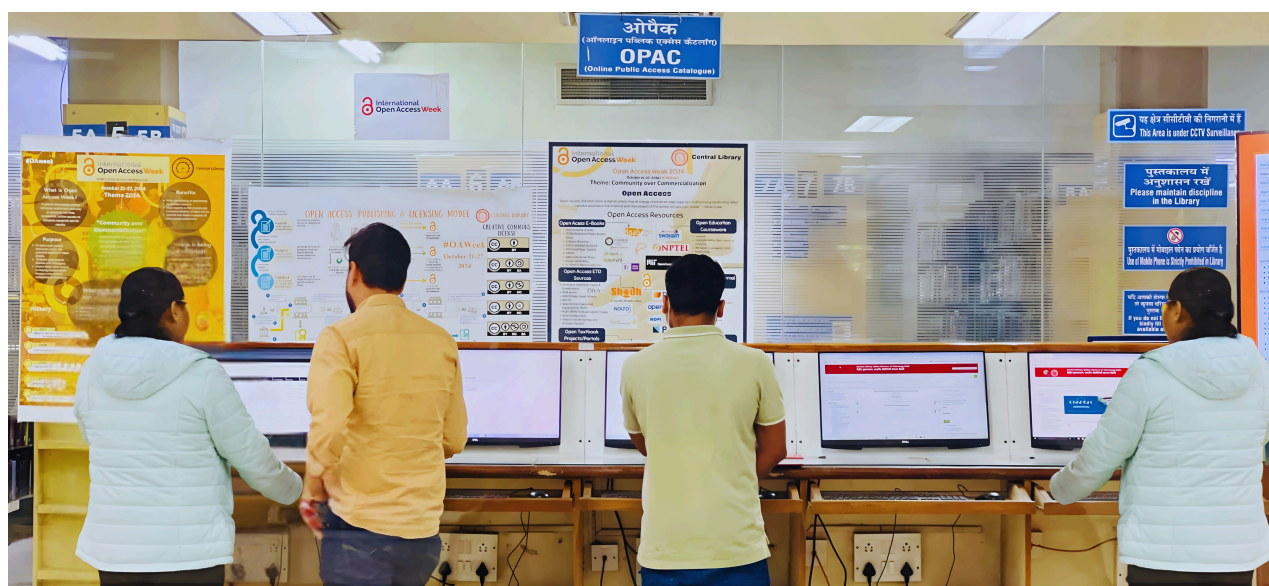
- **Librarian's Office:** It includes the Librarian's room and his secretariat.
- **Library Committee Room:** A dedicated space for workshops, training, user awareness programmes, and seminars organised by the Central Library. It is also used for meetings and discussions related to the library's development and services. The space is also being used by several Institutional Units for similar purposes. It has a capacity of over 75 participants.
- **Reader Services Division:** Reader Services consists of a room for the Incharge of the Section, Circulation Counter with adjoining staff area.
- **Library Circulation Counter:** This is the first point of contact in the Central Library. It facilitates the library membership registration, Check-out, Check-in and renewal of books and other reading materials. Also, it provides inter-library loan and reference services to the library user.



- **New Arrivals Shelves:** Dedicated Display of the newly added physical books, including Hindi books of the Central Library, for a limited period (15 days).



- **Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) Area:** Computer terminals are available for users to search and locate library resources through the OPAC.



- **IITD Faculty & Staff Authored Books:** Display the IITD Faculty/Staff authored books near the circulation counter. The edited books are excluded. The institute faculty/staff are welcome to donate their authored books to the Central Library.

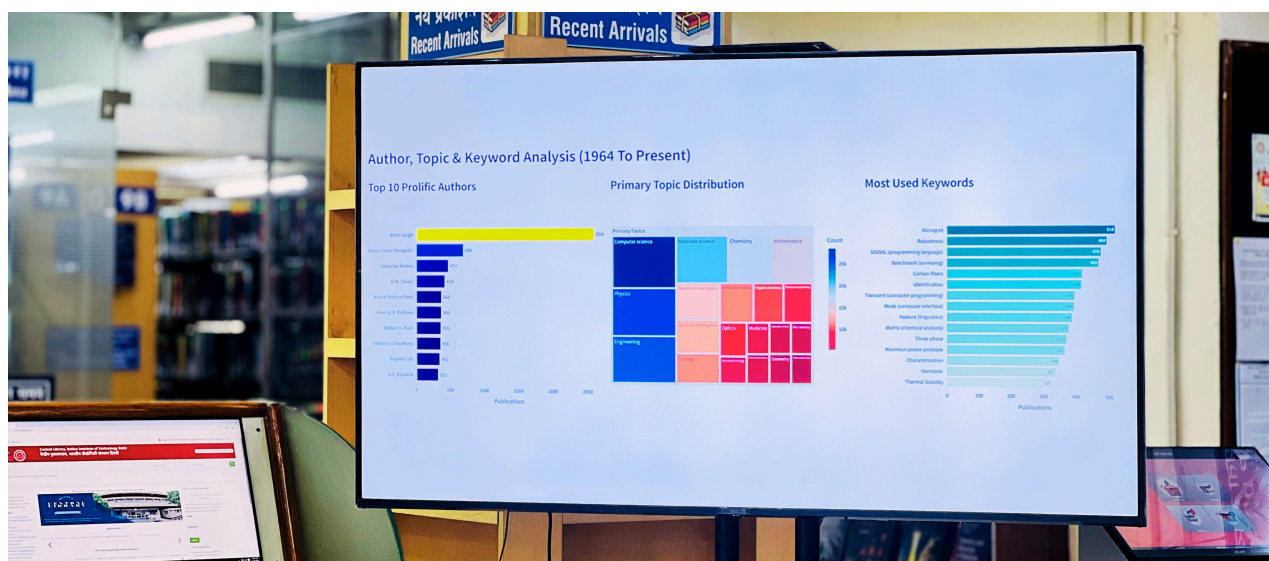


- **Stacks Area:** The first floor houses a stack area for books on Sciences Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), management, computer science, and fine arts. Reference collection, Conference Proceedings (CD) and Hindi Collections are also housed on this floor.
- **Electronic Resources Division & Research Support Services and Outreach Programs:** It consists of a room for the Incharge of the Division, with an adjoining staff area.
- **Library Reading Area:** The Reading areas are available for readers on this floor, which accomodates over 200 users.

- **Property Counter:** It is provided at the Central Library entrance on the first floor for users to keep their personal bags. No valuable items, e.g., Laptop, mobile, money, ATM Cards, etc., should be kept inside the bags. The Central Library will not be responsible for any losses.



- **Book Drop Box:** A facility to return the borrowed books at the user's convenience.
- **People Traffic Counter (PTC):** The RFID-based Smart Card-enabled people traffic counter is installed at the entrance of the Central Library to track users in/out and identify genuine users.
- **RFID Gates:** The Central Library has installed the RFID Gates at the entrance of the first floor to ensure secure and efficient management of library resources.
- **Self-check-in/ out kiosk:** A facility for book borrowing using an RFID Smart card, and users may return with the same kiosk.
- **Digital Display:** A digital display board on the Central Library updates, including outreach programmes, new arrivals, notices, services, etc.



Second Floor - The second floor is currently under renovation; however, the following facilities are planned to be developed as part of the renovation.

Second Floor



- **Officer Cabins and Staff Area:** Two office cabins adjoining the staff working area.
- **Faculty Collaboration Rooms:** A facility for research collaborations and academic interaction among faculty members.
- **Meeting & Discussion Rooms:** A facility for group discussion, meetings, project meetings, etc., for users.
- **AV Room:** A facility to support multimedia-based learning and research. The AV Room is also available for session recordings, editing and presentation.
- **Library Reading Area:** The Reading areas are available for readers on this floor, which accommodates over 600 users.

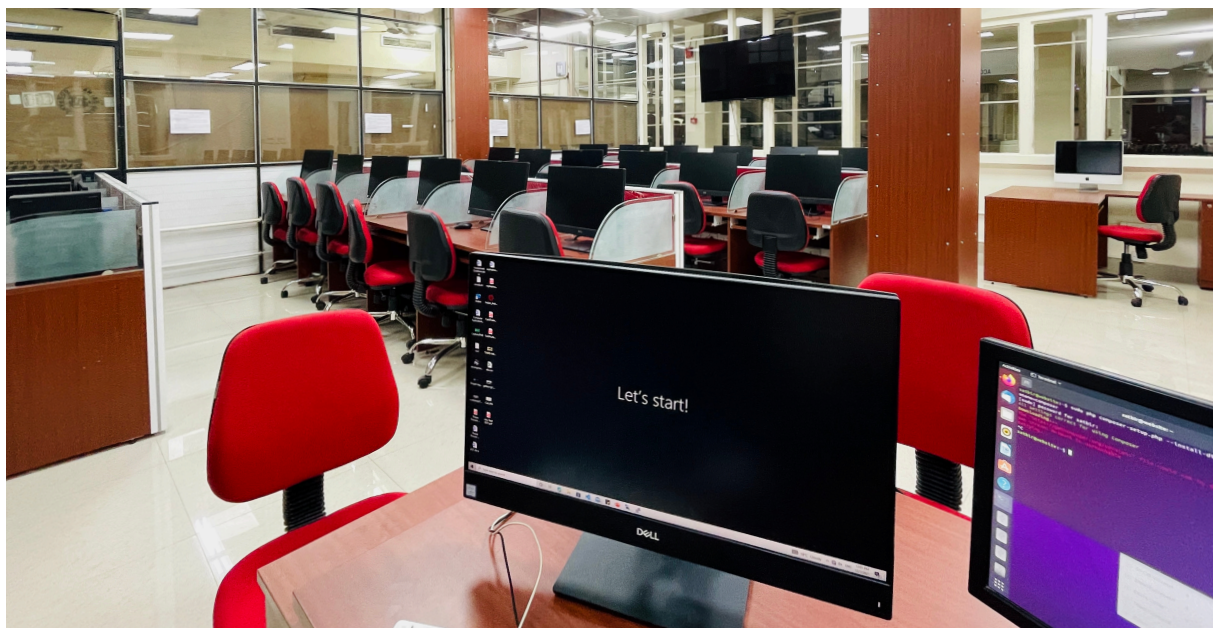

- **Book Stack Area:** All Working/Weekdays/Saturday/Sunday/Public Holidays (9AM to 9PM).
- **Reading Area:** All Working/Weekdays/Saturday/Sunday/Public Holidays (8AM to 3AM), 24x7 during exams.

7 CENTRAL LIBRARY ORGANIZATION & DIVISIONS

7.1 Computer Applications Division (CAD)



Computer Applications Division (CAD) is the heart of the Central Library for its innovative Integrated Automated Services. The division is responsible for managing the Integrated Library Management System using Koha open source software, the Institutional Repository based on the latest version of DSpace, the Management of the Library Website using Drupal, Servers and Networking Management, and overall, the library Website and services through it. The division provides support to all the sections of the Central Library and Departmental Libraries for providing and customising different types of Library Resources and Services using state-of-the-art innovative systems and services. All the services offered by the division operate on the Cloud, known as Baadal. CAD also maintains the state-of-the-art computer lab of the Central Library, helps in troubleshooting in networking and other computer-related issues, apart from providing need-based support to the institute as a whole.

7.2. Reader Services Division (RSD)

The Reader Services Division (RSD) is responsible for the issue, return, and renewal of documents to the members of the Library. Besides faculty, students, research scholars and supporting staff of the Institute, the Central Library also offers memberships to corporate bodies, alumni, and retired faculty. It assists the readers in locating library material. The section is also responsible for providing orientation to new entrants (UG, PG & Research scholars), casual and special visitors. It attends inter-library loan requests and helps students to visit other libraries. The section answers queries of readers about circulation in the specific and the Central Library in general. Readers may approach the Circulation Counter for information or any assistance in the use of the library collections and services. Additionally, the division ensures smooth day-to-day functioning of circulation activities by maintaining accurate user records and transaction logs. It also coordinates with other library units to streamline user experience and improve service delivery. The RSD continuously works towards enhancing user satisfaction.

7.3. Collection Development Division (CDD)

Collection Development Division (CDD) is responsible for identifying, acquiring, processing, organising & providing access to high-quality scholarly resources that meet the scientific and technical education and research needs of the IIT Delhi fraternity. CDD performs a central role in the delivery of basic library services, including collection development and is constantly in the process of increasing the collection of books on Science, Engineering, Technology, Management and Humanities & Social Sciences disciplines.

The CDD is charged with the responsibility of developing the following collections of the Central Library and Departmental Libraries of the institute.

- General Collection (GS)
- Reference Collection (RL)
- Textbooks (TB)
- Book Bank Collection (BB)
- Hindi Collection (H)
- Conference Proceedings (CD)
- Theses (TH)
- IITD Faculty & Staff Authored Books (IITDFSAB)

Technical Processing is a subsequent process of collection development, and it is charged with responsibilities of classification, metadata creation (cataloguing), physical processing and RFID-related activities like tagging, re-tagging and other activities like bar code, spine label generation, tooling, and associated activities, etc. The Universal Decimal Classification (UDC) is being followed for assigning the classification numbers, and widely used metadata standards and rules for creating effective metadata to help users find the library collection effectively through Web OPAC. This section is also serving the institute community by alerting them about newly arrived books from time to time, transferring the departmental library books to respective departments/schools/centres through the proper channel and alerting faculty members who have recommended book(s) once the same is/are available for check-out.

7.4. Electronic Resources Division (ERD)

The Electronic Resources Division (ERD) of the Central Library, IIT Delhi, supports the academic and research needs of users by providing access to a wide range of digital resources such as bibliographic and full-text databases, e-journals, conference proceedings, eBooks, archives, academic writing tools and standards. At present (October 2025), IIT Delhi has access to over 71,000 full-text electronic journals, 9,300 eBooks, and 2,900 archives. Subscriptions are obtained either directly from publishers or exclusive distributors, or through One Nation One Subscription (ONOS).

This division oversees every stage of the electronic resources management lifecycle—from exploring new resources and evaluating trials to acquiring, implementing, reviewing, and renewing them. Access to subscribed resources is provided through IP-based authentication within the campus. For off-campus access, Shibboleth Single Sign-on System, VPN and username and password are used. Authorised users can also enjoy remote access to subscribed e-resources via the institute's secure link: <https://idp.iitd.ac.in>. For convenience, the division also maintains an updated A-Z list of journals, eBooks, and archives. All these resources are integrated with the Discovery service to provide a seamless access experience to the users.

Throughout the year, the division compiles analytical reports to study usage trends and support strategic planning and policymaking. Its core interests include Electronic Resources Management Systems (ERMS), open access, scholarly communication, and the use of cutting-edge technologies to streamline every step of the ERM process.

7.5. Research Support Services and Outreach Programs (RSS&OP)

The Research Support Services and Outreach Program (RSS&OP) section of the Central Library is dedicated to supporting the academic community: students, faculty, and researchers by making research and learning easier and more impactful. Using Research Information Management (RIM) and a range of library resources, services, and tools, we help at every stage of your academic journey from discovering new ideas and designing research to creating and sharing your work.

We also provide reliable data and analyses that support the Institute's academic goals and global rankings. Our outreach activities help users make the best use of library resources, whether they are subscribed to by the library or freely available in open access. We regularly organise Author and Publishing Workshops and help users get the most out of academic writing and research tools like Grammarly, QuillBot, EndNote 21, online databases, and eBooks.

Looking ahead, we aim to make research services even stronger-making it easier to discover and access library and archival materials, data, and e-resources beyond the catalogue. We also create topic-focused guides curated by subject experts, support research collaborations, and organize workshops on research methods by specialists. This section works under the guidance of experienced and dedicated professionals from the Central Library.

7.6. Textbook, Book Bank & Theses (TB & BB)

The Central Library maintains a separate collection of textbooks and a book bank collection. Textbook (TB) collections cater to the needs of courses offered at IIT Delhi. The Book Bank (BB) section caters to the course needs of the B.Tech/B.Des. Students and the books from this section are in high demand throughout the year.

The Theses Section is housed in the same area in which the Text Book & Book Section is located at the Ground Floor. Central Library receives copies of all the Ph.D. theses awarded at IIT Delhi and they are housed in this section. The database of the Ph.D. theses is accessible through the WebOPAC by Title, Author, Supervisor, Department, Year, etc. and also through another interface specially prepared for searching the theses at: <https://ir.iitd.ac.in/home>. IR@IITD (Institutional Repository) makes available the abstracts of the theses on-line (title to content pages) from anywhere in the world.

Full text of the theses are made available at Shodhganga@INFLIBNET Centre, which is a National repository of Full-Text and Theses: <https://shodhganga.inflibnet.ac.in/handle/10603/421373>

7.7. Humanities and Social Sciences (HUSS)

The HUSS section has a strong collection of Humanities and Social Sciences for not only catering to the requirements of the faculty and students of the Department, but also for the varied group of people who are interested in general reading.

7.8. Data Support Services (DSS)

Data support services encompass a broad range of activities aimed at helping organizations and individuals to manage, analyze, and utilize their data effectively. These services include data support, data management, data analysis, data visualization, etc. for different institute purposes.

7.9. Human Resources Development Division (HRDD)

Human Resources Development Division (HRDD) aims to develop skillful and passionate Library and Information professionals in this digital era. HRDD organizes hands-on training, online/offline Workshops, Seminars, in-house training, and more. The theme of these events is related to the enhancement of Library services, including ICT skills, Network Management, Big Data analytics using R, Library Automation, Cloud Management for the Library, Content Management System using Drupal, Library Automation and Management Systems using Koha, Institutional Repository using Dspace, Open Journal System etc. HRDD is careful in continuously evaluating and updating its syllabus, coverage, and the quality of training sessions and upgrading itself to build a promising future for LIS professionals. HRDD involves evaluating the strengths and weaknesses of each LIS professional and paying attention to the development of each individual colleague of the Central Library.

8 MEMBERSHIP

All students, faculty, and employees of the Institute are entitled to membership in the Library. The retired employees and Alumni of the Institute can also avail the Library membership. The Central Library currently has over 13,000 members.

8.2. Corporate Membership

The industrial and corporate houses can become "Corporate Members" of the library for availing the services of the Central Library by making an annual deposit of Rs. 15,000/- and a one-time security (refundable) of Rs. 15,000/-. The corporate Members can avail of consultation/book borrowing facilities. The Corporate members are entitled to borrow a maximum of two books at a time for a period of 14 days.

8.3. Alumni Entry

The IIT Delhi Alumni with a valid Alumni ID are allowed in the Central Library from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. They are not allowed during exams, as per the ACL decision. However, they are not allowed to use the Library Computer Lab/E-resources facilities.

9 POLICY STATEMENTS

9.1. Circulation: Policies and Guidelines

Borrowing Rules

- The readers should check the books thoroughly for missing pages, chapters, etc., while getting them issued.
- No book in damaged condition will be accepted from the users on return. Damaged books will have to be replaced by the borrower.

General Book Section

- Faculty / Student / Staff members having an RFID card can Self Check-in & Self-Check-Out the books using the RFID Self Check-in & Self-Check-Out Kiosk and Book Drop Box at any time till the Library is open.
- If Faculty / Student / Staff members don't have an RFID card, Books can be borrowed from the Circulation Counter, Central Library, from 9:00 AM to 5:30 PM during weekdays and from 10:00 AM to 6:30 PM on weekends/holidays.

Textbook Section

- Two Textbooks can be issued on loan for three days from 9:00 A.M. to 8:45 P.M.
- In some of the books, "Not to be issued" is written; those books cannot be issued; they can be used for reading purposes only.

Conventions for Issues / Return

- General books are issued to all eligible members as per their entitlements.
- Reference books and bound volumes are issued to members with special permission. Please get in touch with the Incharge, Reader Services/Librarian for obtaining permission.
- Theses, dissertations, and CDs are not lent out of the Central Library.
- The renewal of issued book(s) is allowed a maximum of two times, subject to the same not being in demand or reserved by other users. The book(s) which become overdue are not renewable.
- Students are requested to return books on time. No book will be issued to students who have overdue books on their accounts.

Cost recovery of Lost Books by the Library members

The following is the approved criteria for recovering the cost of lost books by library members:

- The lost book should be replaced by a new book with overdue charges, if any and with processing charges of Rs. 100/- for each book.

- In case the book is out of print or not available in the market, then double the cost mentioned in the Accession register should be charged with processing charges of Rs. 100/- for each book with overdue charges, if any.
- Minimum of Rs. 300/- to be charged with processing charges of Rs. 100/- for each book with overdue charges, if any.
- The cost of the book in foreign currency is to be charged at the current conversion rate of the currency.

Overdue Fine

Items that are returned after the due date are considered overdue. Overdue fines are assessed at the following rates:

- Rs. 1.00 per day for the books issued from the General Section
- Rs. 6.00 per day for the books issued from the Text Book Section
- Rs. 1.00 per day for the books issued from the Book Bank Section

Loss of Identity Card/ Library Card

The loss of an Identity Card or bar-coded patron card should be reported to the Institute Security and Readers Services Division of the Central Library. The Institute Security or the concerned section (UG/PG) will issue a duplicate Identity card. Contact Readers Services for the issuance of a barcode. Borrowers shall be responsible for any loss or misuse of their original/duplicate card.

Reservation of the Documents

The books can be reserved through the Library OPAC, or contact the Circulation Counter for the reservation of the Books. Only those books can be reserved which are issued to the users and not available on the shelf. One may also send the email to: rsd@library.iitd.ac.in in this regard.

9.2. Collection Development Policy for Print Collection Development

The Collection Development Policy outlines the broad principles and best practices followed by the Central Library at IIT Delhi. This policy serves as a framework for making decisions about building and managing diverse and relevant print collections in the library to support the teaching, learning, and research needs of the IIT Delhi community. The policy aims to consider the evolving dynamics between teaching and research and the acquisition and management of the print collection by following Melvil Dewey's principle "best reading material for the largest number of users and at the least cost" in the development of print collections.

The collection development policy aims to define the process, primary users, and managerial activities involved in developing diverse print collections. The policy consists of three parts: Collection Development (Section 2), Collection Management (Section 3), and Collection Promotion (Section 4). Collection Development (Section 2) addressed the central library and unit library collection development, collection selection, budget allocation, vendors and sources of collection development, online book procurement, processing, etc. Collection Management (Section 3) address the classification and cataloguing process, collection transfer to unit libraries, stock verification, weeding out, data rectification and validation processes are addressed. Collection Promotion (Section 4) addresses the use guidelines and various initiatives taken to promote and create awareness of library print collections.

9.3. Guidelines for Fair Use of E-Resources



Electronic resources such as e-journals, e-databases, and e-books made available by the Central Library and IIT Delhi are for academic use.

These resources can be searched, browsed, and material may be downloaded and printed as single copies of articles, as is done in the case of printed library material. Downloading or printing of a complete book or an entire issue, or a volume of one or more journals (called systematic downloading) is strictly prohibited.

Use of robots, spiders, or intelligent agents to access, search and/or systematically download from these resources is also prohibited. Any violation of this policy will result in penal action as per the rules and regulations of the Institute.

Please be aware that systematic downloading will cause the publisher to block the entire community of users @ IIT Delhi from accessing these resources.

The Central Library subscribes to thousands of E-Resources directly through the publishers, eSS Consortium and ONOS. The terms and conditions for using these resources are spelt out in electronic resource license agreements with each publisher. It is the responsibility of individual users to ensure that the use of electronic resources does not breach the terms and conditions specified in the license agreements. Licenses vary from publisher to publisher; however, the general principles are as follows:

Permitted



- Viewing, downloading, copying, printing and saving a copy of search results
- Viewing, downloading, copying, printing and saving individual articles
- Using e-resources for scholarly, educational or scientific research, teaching, private study and clinical purposes
- Sending a copy of an article to another authorized user (i.e., current faculty, students or staff)
- Posting the URL to the publisher's version of the article on a class website (publisher links will allow only authorized users access)

Not Permitted

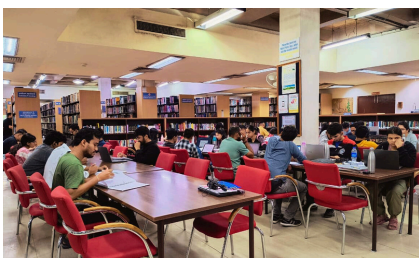


- Use of robots or intelligent agents to do systematic, bulk or automatic downloading is not permitted.
- Systematic downloading or printing of entire journal issues or volumes, or large portions of other e-resources, is not permitted.
- Using e-resources for commercial gain is not permitted (i.e., reselling, redistributing or republishing licensed content).
- Transmitting, disseminating or otherwise making online content available to unauthorized users (i.e., sending to mailing lists or electronic bulletin boards) is not permitted.
- Posting the publisher's version or PDF of an article to an open class website is not permitted (instead, post the URL to the article, which will allow only authorized users access).

9.4. General Rules

- All students, faculty, and employees of the Institute are entitled to obtain membership of the Central Library.
- Institute RFID cards are non-transferable, users must carry their Institute ID card while using the Central Library.
- The Security Personnel at the Central Library gate will check all personal belongings, including Central Library books issued to a member.
- Users are not allowed to carry eatables/drinks (except water) inside the Central Library.
- Personal Bags should be kept at the Property Counter. No valuable items, e.g., Laptop, mobile, money, ATM Cards, etc., should be kept inside the bags. If kept, the Central Library will not be responsible for any such loss.
- The Central Library shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to the personal belongings of the users.
- Users should check the books before borrowing them to ensure that they are not damaged.
- Users should not write upon, damage or mark any book belonging to the Central Library.
- Marking, scratching, damaging, mutilating, stealing library materials, or property will invite disciplinary action against the defaulters.
- Books removed from the shelves, if not required further, should be kept on the nearest book trolley/ table. Please do not try to shelve them yourself. Please remember that a book misplaced is a book lost.
- The Central Library reserves the right to call back any issued book/item at any time.
- Do not engage in audible conversation in any part of the Central Library; users should observe strict silence inside the Central Library so that others are not disturbed.
- Use of Mobile phones is not permitted inside the Central Library.
- Reading areas are meant for individual study and research only.
- Users should not rest or keep their feet on tables, chairs, shelves, etc.
- Computer Lab furniture should strictly be used with discipline, i.e., should not lean back on chairs, should not sleep and also should not bring the liquid to the Lab, etc.
- Smoking, pan chewing and spitting in the library is prohibited.
- Users are not allowed to share their Proxy ID and Password with other students.
- The users should not leave their reading material and personal belongings on the reading tables unattended. If found unattended for a long time, beyond 24 hours, it may be removed, and the Central Library will not be responsible for the same. The same will also be disposed of using standard procedures.
- Playing games/ watching movies on computers is strictly prohibited in the entire library premises.
- Computers in the library premises should be used for academic purposes only. Online chatting/ dating, browsing social networking sites is strictly prohibited. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulters.
- Users must take care of their pen drives, mobiles, wallets, and other valuables. The Central Library is not responsible for any losses.
- Membership privileges of a user can be suspended on account of misbehaviour with the library staff or for indecent manners. Maintaining discipline in the broadest sense is the motto of the Central Library.

- By entering the Central Library premises, users agree that they may appear in library-related photographs, videos, or promotional content shared on official library social media platforms or in other library spaces, whether virtual or physical.
- These rules are subject to revision/change from time to time without assigning any reason. The Librarian is free to make any decision in the interest of the Central Library or institution.

11.1. Hindi Collection

The Central Library, IIT Delhi, has built up a good collection of printed books in the Hindi language. It also has a collection of the Sage Bhasha Hindi collection, which comprises 93 eBooks in Hindi. The users can access these eBooks at <https://evidya.sagepub.in/evidya/library>. These eBooks can be accessed simultaneously within the campus. Books available in the Central Library in the Hindi language include books on a variety of subjects, including Hindi literature by prominent authors.



These books are prominently displayed on the first floor near the reference area in the Central Library. To increase the usage of these books, the Central Library offers a borrowing facility of one extra Hindi Book to all its members apart from their entitlement.

12 ORGANISATION OF THE COLLECTION

The Central Library, IIT Delhi, is currently using the Universal Decimal Classification scheme for organising library materials. This system uses Indo-Arabic numerals, special characters and alphabets to allocate a unique call number to every book.




Central Library at IIT Delhi offers an array of services to support the teaching, research, institution building, outreach and other activities of the faculty members, students and staff of the institute.


14.1. Book Borrowing Facility from Unit Libraries

The Central Library offers book borrowing facilities from the unit libraries of the institute. Users may request books from any Unit Library through the Central Library (Circulation Counter). The Central Library coordinates with the respective Unit Libraries to make the requested books available within 1–2 days. All such borrowed books must be returned to the Central Library (Circulation Counter).

14.2. Data Support Services

Data Support Services provides comprehensive support for all data-related needs within the organization. We ensure the accuracy, accessibility, and security of data to empower our teams to make data-driven decisions. Our services span from data management and analytics to consultation and training, tailored to meet the unique requirements of each department.

The Central Library, IIT Delhi, provides a Discovery Service (Single Window Search) that enables users to search and access books, journals, theses, databases, and other e-resources through a unified interface. All the resources of the IIT Delhi are accessible through the ExLibris Summon Discovery Service platform, which provides a single access point to bibliographical, full-text and internal resources using the landing page of the Central Library.

14.4. Document Delivery Services

The Central Library provides research articles/book chapters/standards available with IIT Delhi in electronic form to the authorised users of IIT Delhi. If the requested document, including the printed book, is not available in the library, the Central Library arranges the same from other institutions in Delhi as well as from other parts of India through the Developing Library Network (DELNET).

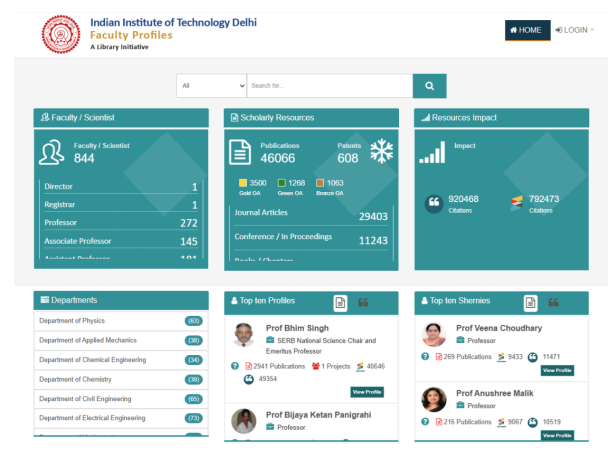
14.5. IIT Delhi Faculty & Staff Authored Books

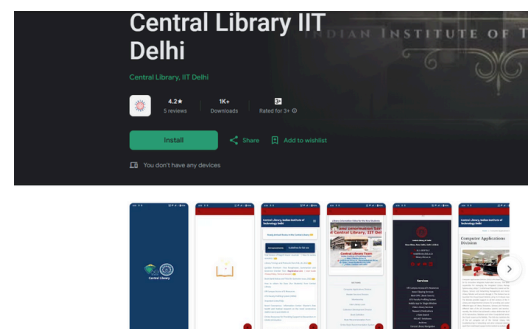
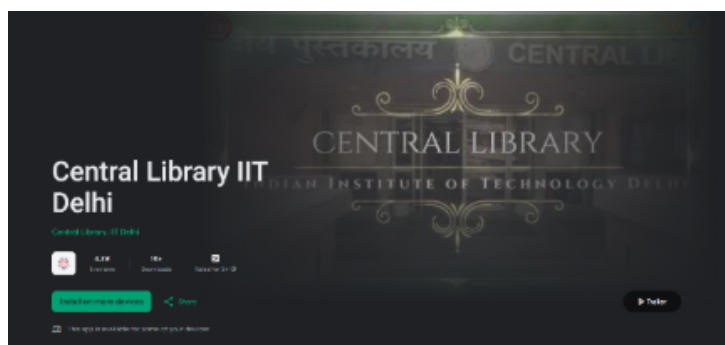

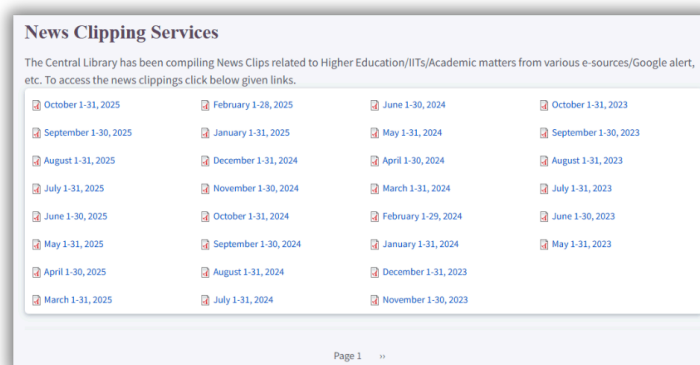
14.9. Monthly New Arrivals of Printed Collections



14.12. Online Book Recommendation System


The Central Library has developed the new Online Book Recommendation System using Koha (Open Source LMS) to facilitate a convenient recommendation system for faculty members. The faculty members can recommend the book(s) for the Central Library and the concerned departmental library through the online system. It provides the following user-friendly features to recommend and approve the book(s) quickly.

Salient Features

- Faculty members will receive email notices on each recommendation and approval, and disapproval by HoD/HoC/HoS.
- HoD/HoC/HoS will receive the request for approval alert mail whenever the respective department/school/centre faculty member recommends a book(s).
- Provides the updated automatic status on the procurement progress of recommended book(s).
- The system has been integrated with the IITD Kerberos ID and Password for login.



14.13. Online Public Access Catalogue (Book Search)



The Central Library's Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) can be accessed on the Intranet and Internet to search all the records available in the Central Library database through a web-based search interface. The OPAC can be searched by author, title, subject, keywords, classified number, publisher, etc.

14.14. Article Processing Charges (APC) Support for Journals

The One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) Initiative from the PSA, Govt. of India, has a component for Article Publishing Charges/ Article Processing Charges (APC). The authors from an ONOS Registered institution, including IIT Delhi, get financial support for publishing articles in selected good-quality open-access journals. 14.15. Pathfinder (Subject Bibliographies)

A pathfinder is a bibliography on the author, subject, and known personality, to promote usage and to create awareness among the user community. It lists the various resources available in the Central Library and helps library users with teaching, learning, and research. 14.16. Photocopying Facilities

The Central Library provides photocopying facilities through an external vendor on a payment basis.

14.17. Physical Book Exhibitions



The Central Library, IIT Delhi, in collaboration with the IIT Delhi Empanelled Book Vendors, regularly organizes the Physical & Virtual Book Exhibitions. The exhibitions provide an open platform for the institute fraternity to visit, choose, review, recommend, and procure the books displayed by the vendors. The students/faculty of IIT Delhi can review each book and recommend it to strengthen the library's physical book collections.

14.18. Research Data Management Services

Management of research data is very important, and its planning starts from the very beginning of the research. The Central Library provides support in this area wherever needed.

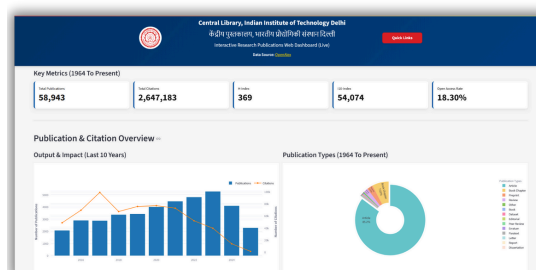

14.21. Take a Book / Give a Book Program

The Central Library, IIT Delhi, offers a platform, i.e., Take a Book / Give a Book, to promote reading among users of the institute and enable the reuse of books, including textbooks. We invite users who would like to share their personal copies of books after finishing reading may leave their books on the dedicated Bookshelf located on the first floor of the Central Library (near the entrance gate). Similarly, feel free to Take a Book, left by another user.



14.22. Thematic Book Display

IIT Delhi Library regularly organizes thematic book displays to mark important occasions and encourage engagement with its collections. Curated around events such as Ambedkar Jayanti, Gandhi Jayanti, National Book Week, National Librarians' Day, and Open Access Week, these displays highlight selected books and scholarly resources. They promote wider reading, support academic awareness, and provide the IIT Delhi community with easy access to materials that celebrate knowledge, culture, and learning.

14.23. Video Library Service

The Central Library offers the video library services through its computer lab which consists of video recordings of a series of classroom lectures delivered by the IIT faculty to the students.

14.24. Virtual Reference Collections

The Virtual Reference Collection is a collection of various web-based information resources which identified, gathered, evaluated, and systematized to help you access a wide range of information resources. These collections enable you to find the required teaching and scholarly research information effectively and help keep up to date with the latest developments in the profession. These collections cover scholarly search engines,

e-print archives, open textbooks, open courseware, digital libraries, and sources on finding theses & dissertations, patents & standard sources, professional organizations, and societies.



15 COMPUTERIZED SERVICES

The library has its sub-LAN, which is connected to the Campus LAN. It has a Computer Lab for the users of the library as well. The Wi-Fi facilities are also available in the Central Library.

15.1. Computerization of in-house activities

The Central Library, IIT Delhi, is a fully computerized and digitally transformed facility,



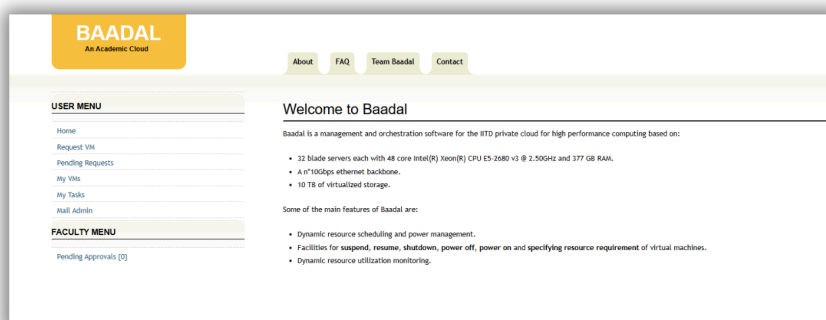
offering technology-driven services to its users. The library operates on Koha (open-source ILMs) integrated with RFID for automated circulation and is hosted on Cloud Baadal, ensuring high availability without server maintenance. Users can access resources through the OPAC, Library Mobile App, discovery service, an AI-powered chatbot (BibDAIL+) for instant assistance, and QR based feedback system. The Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), Discovery Service,

Single Window Search of the Library and Library App can be used to search bibliographic records and full texts available through web-based search interfaces on Intranet as well as on the Internet.

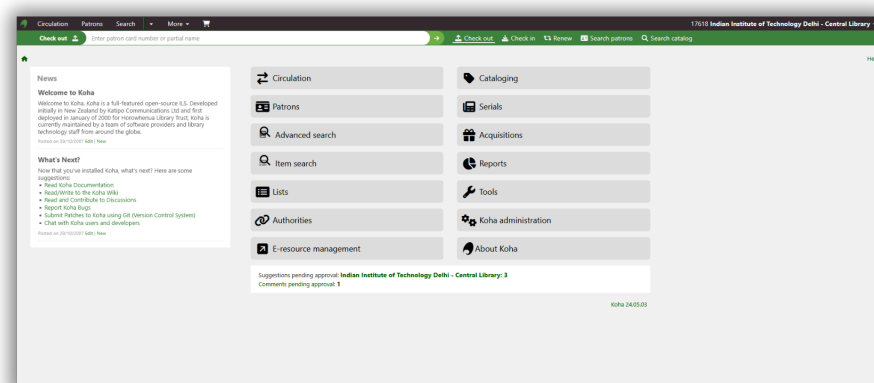
Research support is strengthened through IRINS faculty profiling, the Institutional Repository (DSpace), and Shodhganga integration for theses. Additional services include a video library, remote access via VPN/Shibboleth, automated email alerts, and inter library loan and resource sharing. Facilities such as photocopying, scanning, digital printing, and binding further enhance user convenience.

15.2. Cloud server

The Central Library at IIT Delhi has transitioned its entire library system and digital services to Cloud Baadal, the institute's in-house cloud computing environment. By using this cloud infrastructure, the library has adopted the 'No Servers-No Maintenance' practices.



15.3. Integrated Library Management System (ILMS)



The Central Library, IIT Delhi, has fully automated its processes using Koha, a comprehensive open-source Integrated Library System (ILMS). The Central Library is currently running on Koha version 24.05.03 and ensures -

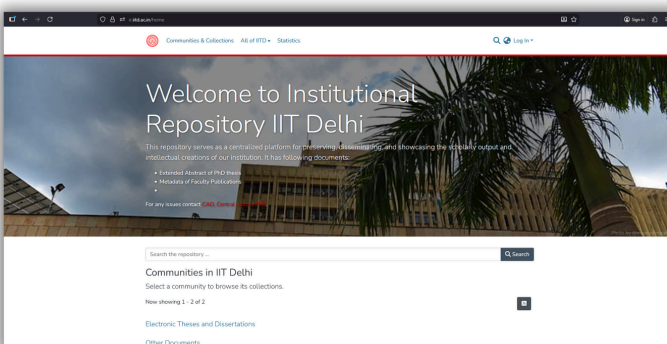
regular updates to benefit from the latest features and enhancements. All major modules of Koha are extensively used, including Circulation, Cataloguing, Suggestions, Acquisition, Reports, Tools, and Administration. The Acquisition module has been customized to align with the library's collection development workflow.

Additionally, the Central Library has implemented an online book recommendation system and an Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) to provide seamless and user-friendly access to the collections.

15.4. RFID Technology in the Library

The Central Library is an early adapter of emerging and innovative technologies and has been using RFID technology since 2010. It is the best automation system used worldwide and is an effective way of managing collections of the library and providing enhanced services to the users having benefits like: self-check-out of books, self-check-in (book drop), to control theft, to find misplaced reading material, sorting, inventory accuracy, stock verification procedures, security control, video surveillance, people counter, Smart Card issuance, etc. It is an automatic data capture technology that uses tiny microchips and miniature antennas affixed to documents. RFID plays a vital role in redefining the library processes to make everyone's job easier, right from the users to the library staff. IIT Delhi library has one of the most successful running RFID implementations in the country.

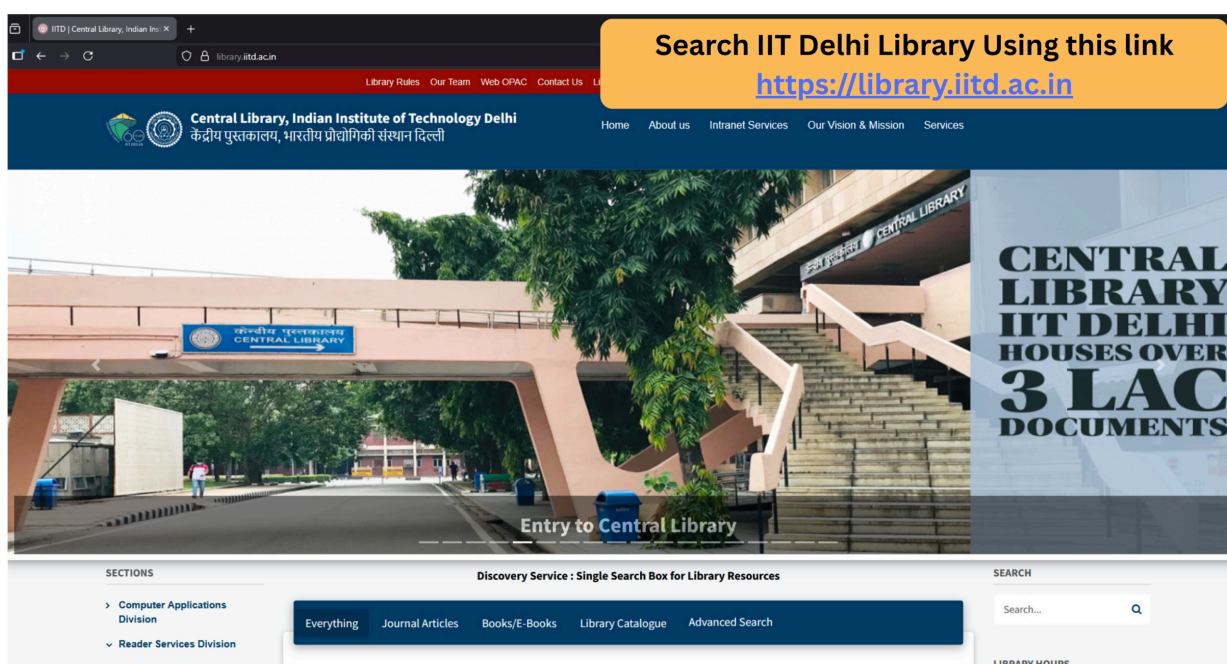
16 INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORY

It introduces emerging trends and tools such as library automation, digitization, digital repositories, consortia services, social media, open access, AI, machine learning, IoT, AR/VR, and green libraries. The course emphasizes the growing importance of librarians in rankings, accreditation, and innovative service delivery. Intended for teachers, researchers, students, and library/ IT professionals, it aims to enhance skills, foster collaboration, extend services beyond traditional spaces, and prepare LIS professionals for new roles in a changing information environment. It has successfully delivered two versions of the 16-week FDP on the Swayam Platform with over three thousand learners each time, with the Librarian of the IITD, Dr Nabi Hasan, as its Coordinator. 22.2. NPTEL 2024- Science Communication: Research Productivity and Data Analytics using Open Source Software

The Central Library runs 12 Week, 3 credits NPTEL MOOCs on "Science Communication: Research Productivity and Data Analytics using Open Source Software".



The course focuses on research assessment and mapping tools used to evaluate knowledge creation through publications. It covers concepts such as research metrics, data extraction, preprocessing, visualization tools, ethics, and software like RStudio, VOSviewer, and Citespace. Case studies on institutions, authors, journals, and countries are included. Designed for faculty, researchers, students, policymakers, and information professionals, the course requires no prior knowledge of mathematics, statistics, or programming.

By completion, learners will gain skills to conduct and publish scientometric analyses, supporting academia, research organizations, accreditation agencies, publishers, and policymakers. 22.3. IITD-UCL-SKS Online Certificate Course on OPEN SCIENCE



The Central Library offers a free online certificate course, titled “Focus on Open Science Delhi - Creating a Research Culture for the 21st Century” with University College London and Scientific Knowledge Services Germany. This course focuses on Open Science and its potential to transform research. Key topics include research reproducibility and access to publicly funded research, data sharing policies and infrastructure in India, ethical aspects of reproducibility, scholarly communication and resistance to change, addressing inequalities, inclusivity, ethics, and links between science and society, and re-shaping public-private partnerships. The course explores the role of research organizations in the transition to Open Science and challenges in adopting efficient communication models. The overarching aim is to foster a more transparent, collaborative, and equitable research ecosystem by addressing existing inequalities and improving the links between science and society.
